Communication

Encourage your child to ask questions about the world around them.

Have conversations with your child encouraging them to listen and take turns in speaking.



The children have been playing lots of sound games with their teachers such as saying the first sound in words, clapping syllables and identifying sounds in the environment.

Physical Development

- Encourage your child to throw and catch with a range of different sized balls. Can they hit a ball with a bat?
- Can they stand on one leg? Hold a pose whilst you count to 10?
- Encourage your child to use scissors to snip.
- When holding a pencil encourage them to hold their pencil like this





Story time

Children love to hear stories! Your children have been learning the story of the 3 little pigs and after hearing it over and over, they are beginning to be able to tell you the story themselves.



When sharing a story ask questions about what you have read- who is in the story? What happened at the end of the story? If you pause mid story, can they suggest what might happen next?

Special people and places

We will be learning about people who help us such as farmers and how they help the animals on the farm. We will also be thinking about how teachers help us and who the teachers will be as the children move into Reception. This will help them with their transition into Reception.

Numbers

We have been encouraging the children to notice amounts as they play and this will help with their understanding of number.







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Mark Making

The children are being encouraged to have a go at writing their name as they come into nursery each morning. This is also something they can practise at home. Please teach your child to write in lower case letters with a captial at the start of their name as below.
